The U.S. Bureau of Labø Statistics projects 15 percent growth in health care jobs over the decade ending in 2029 and the creation of some 2.4 million new jobs.

Graduates of our program are prepared for immediate employment in a number of public health fields, such as community health, health education, health/safety administration, public policy, biostatistics, epidemiology and environmental health.
