Applicants to the MSOT program are processed through St. Bonaventure's Free Occupational Therapy Program Application. SBU also receives applications through the Occupational Therapist Centralized Application Service (OTCAS) or through the SBU Early Assurance Pathways. Applicants must submit all official transcripts from all colleges/universities previously attended as evidence of completion of prerequisites, three letters of recommendation, and a personal essay. Applicants are accepted on a rolling basis until class capacity is reached.

Qualified incoming freshmen (or current SBU students) can pursue a seat in our MSOT program by selecting an Early Assurance Pathway (EAP).

Applicants to occupational therapy via EAP may pursue one of two tracks: our accelerated 3+2 pathway or our traditional 4+2 pathway. While in a pre-OT track, students can earn credit for the first semester of the occupational therapy program.
